Housing Situation in Armenia

The number of families needing to improve their housing conditions in Armenia is over 64,000, out of which 26,199 families are homeless (Social Reforms in Armenia.) Most of them are living in metal containers (domiks), basements and other temporary shelters.



Fuller Center for Housing Armenia Background

Fuller Center for Housing Armenia is a covenant partner of The Fuller Center for Housing, established in the spring of 2005. After 29 years of unwavering and tireless service to the poor with Habitat for Humanity, Millard Fuller, the founder and president of Habitat for Humanity, was motivated to expand his vision of eliminating substandard housing worldwide. Fuller Center for Housing Armenia was registered in the spring of 2008.

Mission and Goals

Fuller Center for Housing Armenia (FCHA) is a non-government charitable organization that supports community development in the Republic of Armenia by assisting in building and renovating simple, decent and affordable homes, as well as advocating the right to decent shelter as a matter of conscience and action. FCHA provides **long-term, interest-free mortgage loans to low-income families.** The monthly repayments flow into the Revolving Fund and are used to help more families, thereby providing financial foundation for sustainable community development.

Types of Programs

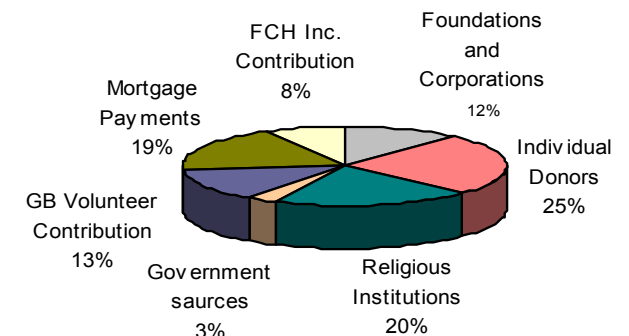
The construction programs of Fuller Center for Housing Armenia include:

- *completion of half-built homes*
- *purchase of affordable apartments*
- *roof reconstruction*
- *heating and sanitation system installation*
- *interior renovation and weather-proofing.*

As of November 2011, FCHA supported **184 families**, and currently **10 houses** are under construction.
