Housing Situation in Armenia

Of approximately 800,000 families living in Armenia, the number of families needing renovation of housing conditions is approximately 75,000, from which 30,000 families are without permanent shelter and are living in metal shipping containers (domiks).



Fuller Center for Housing Armenia Background

Fuller Center for Housing Armenia is a covenant partner of The Fuller Center for Housing, established in the spring of 2005. After 29 years of unwavering and tireless service to the poor with Habitat for Humanity, Millard Fuller, founder and president of Habitat, was motivated to expand his vision of eliminating substandard housing worldwide. Fuller Center for Housing Armenia was registered in Spring 2008.

Fuller Center for Housing Armenia is a Non-government Charitable Organization that supports community development in the Republic of Armenia by assisting in building and renovating simple, decent and affordable homes, as well as advocating the right to decent shelter as a matter of conscience and action. Fuller Center Armenia provides **long-term, no inflation included, interest-free loans to low-income families**. The monthly repayments flow into the Revolving Fund and are used to help more families, thereby providing the financial foundation for sustainable community development.

Types of Programs

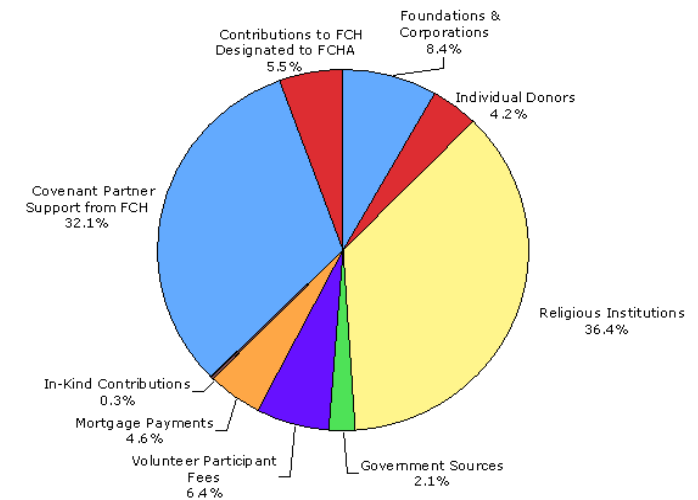
The construction programs of Fuller Center for Housing Armenia include:
